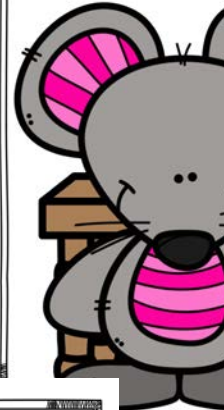

Evaluate

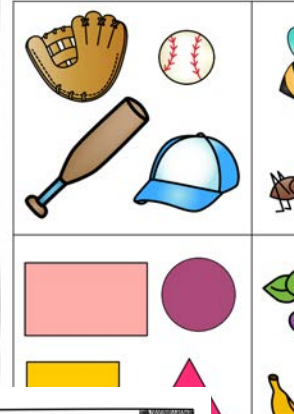
to form a judgment based on evidence
